

Lesson 26

"The Spirit and the Bride Say, 'Come'"

[This chapter is based on Revelation, Chapter 22]

When God created Planet Earth, it was perfect! And the people He created were perfect! In fact, the Bible says that when God took inventory of all that He had made, He said that it was very good.

God's original plan for Planet Earth and its inhabitants was that they should be perfect forever. However, Adam and Eve were free to choose whom they would believe and obey, so a God of infinite wisdom had an alternate plan in reserve in the event that man should mar His beautiful original plan for Planet Earth.

When God was forced to evict Adam and Eve from their garden home because of their disobedience, God revealed His plan to restore them to His family and eternal life-His original plan. He said, "I will put enmity between you [the serpent] and the woman, and between your seed and her Seed; He shall bruise your head and you shall bruise His heel." Genesis 3:15.

It must have been at this time that God instituted the ceremonial system, as He provided Adam and Eve garments to wear made of animal skins, bringing the reality of death to Planet Earth. The sacrifice of animals was instituted to remind mankind that sin brought death, either to the one who had committed the sin or to a substitute who would die in his place.

So it was that a loving God gave His only begotten Son to be forever attached to this world. We are children of the King of the universe, and we shall live and reign with Him forever and ever. Praise the Lord!

Revelation Speaks - 4

NOTE: Young couples who are in love show that they want to live together for the rest of their lives by being married. Newborn Christians show their desire to live and follow Christ for all time and eternity by being baptized, thus declaring that they are one with the Saviour, having "put on Christ."

NOTE: It was to Abraham of old that the promise was given that his seed would inherit the earth. The Bible tells us that, "he looked for a city which hath foundations, whose builder and maker is God" (Hebrews 11:10). And if we are Christ's, we are heirs according to this promise!

14. What example did Christ set for us in being baptized by John the Baptist? Matthew 3:13-17.

NOTE: Jesus never sinned; therefore, it was not necessary for Him to be baptized for His sin, but He left us a perfect example of what God expects of us by being baptized in order that "He might fulfill all righteousness" (Matthew 3:15). No wonder we read in verse 17, 'And lo, a voice from heaven saying, this is my beloved Son in whom I am well pleased."

NOTE: When we understand the sacrifice of Christ and God's great love for us, the question comes to us, "Why tarriest thou?" Yes, as we accept Jesus as our Lord and Saviour and "put on Christ" by being baptized, our names will be registered in the Book of Life. What an honor!

Revelation Speaks - 5

NOTE: From Genesis to Revelation, God's favorite word to His children on earth seems to be "COME."

For 120 years, Noah gave God's message to the corrupt and evil antediluvian world: "COME." And while everyone else was walking away from God and safety, the people who were committed to God, who had put Him above every other consideration, accepted His last invitation: "COME THOU AND ALL THY HOUSE INTO THE ARK" Genesis 7:1.

Noah and his wife, along with their three sons and their wives, walked up the gangplank into the ark. Then God shut the door, forever sealing the fate of the antediluvians. How sad!

God's invitation to the rebellious Israelites was, "Come now, and let us reason together. . . though your sins be as scarlet, they shall be white as snow; though they be red like crimson, they shall be as wool" Isaiah 1:16-18. What love!

Jesus' gracious invitation to His followers was: "Come unto Me, all ye that labour and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest" Matthew 11:28. What a wonderful promise!

God's final invitation to earth's inhabitants is "COME" and receive the "water of life" that will satisfy every longing of your heart. Today the door of mercy is wide open.
